# **Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart**

Concerto in E Flat KV 365 for two pianos and orchestra.

Written in early 1779 for himself and his sister Nannerl who was almost five years older than her brother. This was the last of his compositions to be written in Salzberg. When he moved to Vienna he added parts for two clarinets, two trumpets and timpani. The dialogue between the pianos in this concerto is both light-hearted and enchanting.

"Ave Verum" was written late in his life, just before he began his Requiem. Mozart wrote the "Ave Verum" whilst visiting his wife who was convalescing outside Vienna. It was written purely as a choral motet.

# Serge Rachmaninoff

Rapsody on a theme by Paganini opus 43.

The theme for this composition was based on the last of paganini's Caprices op 1 for unaccompanied violin. There are 24 variations which are grouped into three sections (1-10, 11-18, and 19-24) each with a clear identity. The manuscript was completed quickly, in a matter of weeks and was first performed by the composer on November 11, 1934, with the Philadelphia Orchestra conducted by Leopold Stokowski. The work has vied with his second piano concerto as Rachmaninoff's most popular work.

# Johannes Brahms

Sonata in E Minor op 38 for pianio and cello.

1st movement, Allegro Non Troppo. This is the first of Brahms' two sonatas for piano and cello and was written between 1862 and 1865. It is in well defined classical form with the German 19th Century romanticism typical of Brahms. The character is dark and elegiac and Brahms emphasises this by keeping most of the principal themes for the cello in a minor key.

The full work comprises three movements - Sonata form, Minuet and Trio Style, and Fugue - and this first movement is in 4/4 time, strongly contrapuntal, lyrical but sombre.

#### Bach

"Jesu-Joy of Man's Desiring" is a setting of a chorale taken from Cantala 147. Probably originally written for choir and small orchestra but more recently transcribed for many combinations of instruments and voice.

## Handel

"And the Glory of the Lord" is a famous chorus taken from Messiah, and is a setting of the words from Isaiah Chapter 5.

# Robert Schmidli
